




PSALM FOR THE WILD-BUILT



VERY SECRET SOCIETY OF IRREGULAR WITCHES



In Becoming Fluent, Richard Roberts and Roger Kreuz draw on insights from psychology and cognitive science to show that adults can master a foreign language if they bring to bear the skills and knowledge they have honed over a lifetime. Adults shouldn't try to learn as children do; they should learn like adults. They report evidence that adults can learn new languages even more easily than children. and they show how to leverage this metalinguistic ability in learning a new language. If adult learners apply the tools acquired over a lifetime, it can be enjoyable and rewarding.
