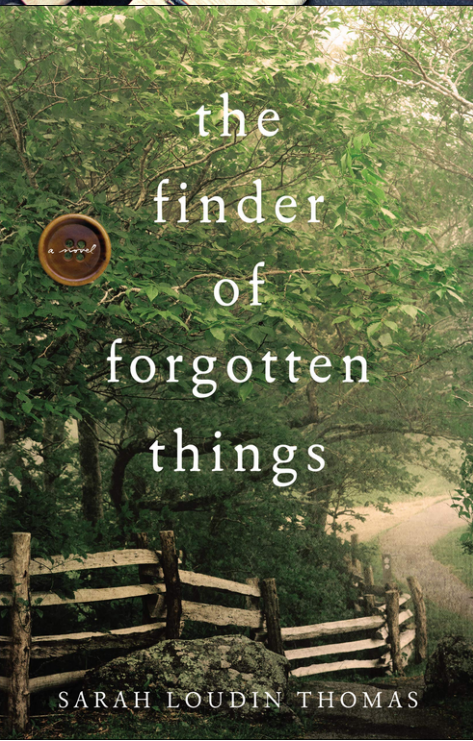

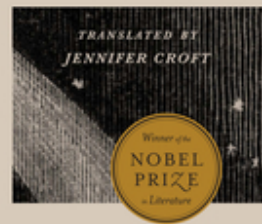


THE BOOKS OF JACOB Olga Tokarczuk

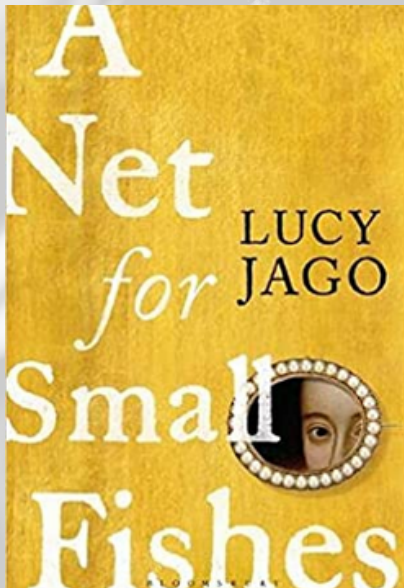
THE RECKLESS KIND Carly Heath

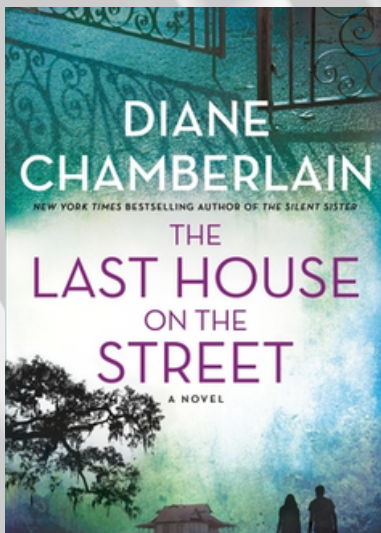
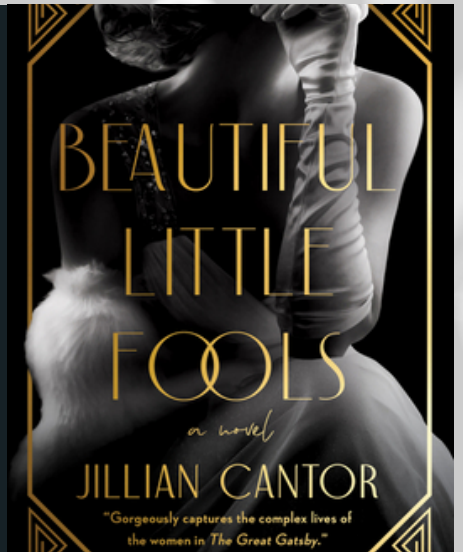

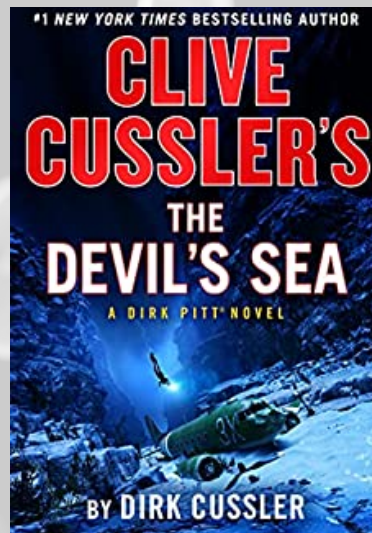

THE DEVIL'S SEA

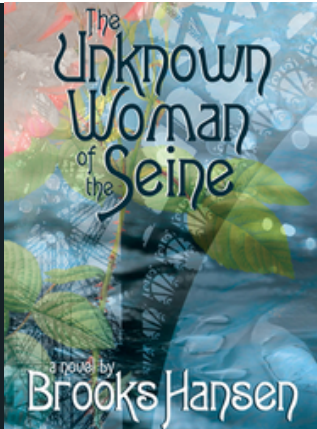
Dirk Cussler

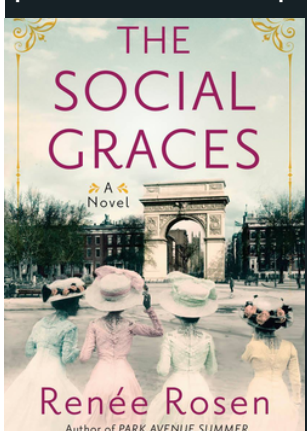

Orphans of the Storm dives into the waters of the past to unearth a sweeping, epic tale of the sinking of the Titanic that radiates with humanity and hums with life.

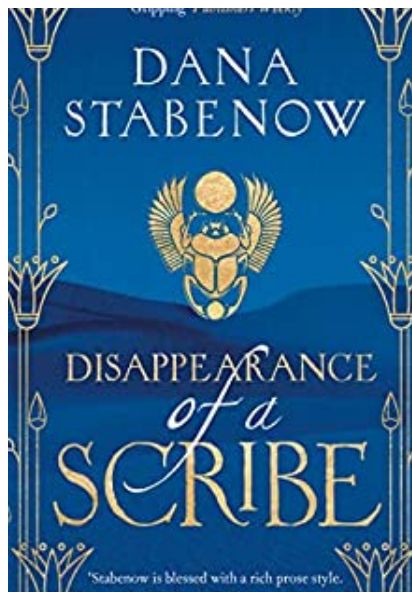
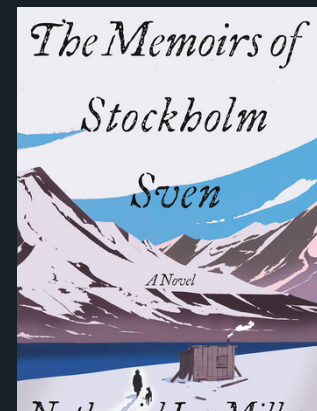


THE MEMOIRS OF STOCKHOLM SVEN

DISAPPEARANCE OF A SCRIBE

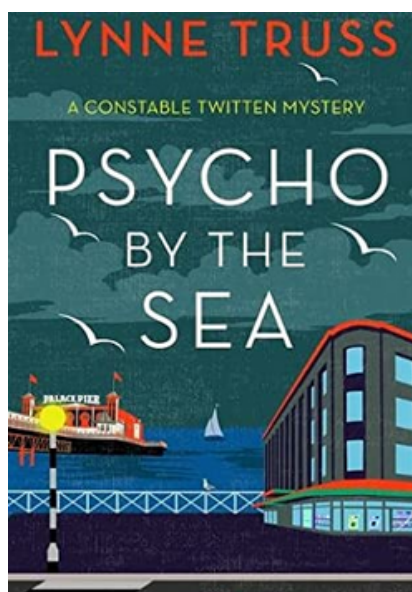
