Flash Points (Foreign Policy Magazine) [middle-of-the-road]

Institute for the Study of War [frequently interviewed on NPR & Fox News] Nicholas Kristof (New York Times) [covers a wide range of topics, leans left] The Flip Side [a news aggregator, non-partisan]

The Agenda (Heritage Foundation) [best presentation of conservative views] The Interpreter (New York Times) [inconsistent, sometimes very good, sometimes just liberal gibberish]

Informed Comment [a lot of Middle East coverage]

Water's Edge [often adds historical perspective, very balanced]
